Bible Story: SAMSON'S STORY

There once was a man named Samson. God made him very strong. God told Samson not to cut his hair. His hair was part of how God made him strong. Samson listened to God, and he was very strong. But one day, someone cut his hair, and he wasn't strong anymore. But God still loved him! And when Samson talked to God, God helped him again

- Who made Samson strong?" → God!
- "What was special about Samson's hair?" → God told him not to cut it
- Who made your hair?" → God did!

Life Application:

Samson was strong because of his hair. Tell the kids that they may not have muscles like Samson, but God made you strong in your own way!" .It can mean **showing courage**, **kindness**, **or self-control**.

1. Being Strong Means Being Brave

Example:

"You were strong when you went down the big slide even though you were a little scared!"

Say to the child: "Wow! You were brave — that's being strong!"

2. Being Strong Means Helping Others

Example:

"You helped your friend pick up toys — that was a strong and kind thing to do!"

Say to the child: "God gives you strength to help others!"

3. Being Strong Means Controlling Our Feelings

Example:

"You didn't hit when you were mad. You took a deep breath instead — that was strong!"

Say to the child: "That's strong — choosing to be kind even when it's hard!"

4. Being Strong Means Telling the Truth

Example:

"You told the truth when you spilled the juice — that was strong and honest!"

Say to the child: "Telling the truth is strong and brave!"

5. Being Strong Means Trying Again

Example:

"You kept trying to put your shoes on all by yourself — that's being strong!"

Say to the child: "You didn't give up! That's what strong people do!"

✓ Simple Toddler Definition:

"Being strong means doing the right thing, even when it's hard."

You can repeat with them:

God helps me be strong!"

"I can be strong like Samson!"
