

Fun Games to Play

THE TELEPHONE GAME

Mechanics of the Game:

- Create two or more teams and let them fall in line.
- Turn them around except to the first player in the ahead of the line.

PIRING-PIRINGAN Mechanics:

- There will be 1 pair and one of them are blindfolded and the other will command the directions.
- The blindfolded ones have to memorize the voice of his/her partner and go to their partner quickly in order for them to win.
- The teacher will going to place the the one who is blindfolded on a place that he/she didn't know where his/her partner were.

RED LIGHT, GREEN LIGHT. Mechanics:

- Players all line up at a starting point. The goal is to be the first onto reach the end point — or finish line.
- When the teacher says "Green!" every player runs. As soon as the teacher yells "red" every player has to stop... immediately.
- If anyone moves, they are OUT and cannot continue the race. We even yell "yellow" to change things up for a super slow walk.

SEARCH IT! Mechanics:

- Make two groups and place a basket full of assorted balls between them.
- Also, place 2 baskets where they can draw out their balls.
- Make a marked line for them- a starting line and a line where only the baskets are placed.
- The teacher will declare the color and number of the balls that the student need to place to the their own basket.
- Ex: The teacher will declare that the students will going to search for 5 blue balls and the player who put the 5 balls first to their basket wins 1 point.

STOP DANCE Mechanics:

- The teacher will play a music to the kids and they will going to dance.
- The teacher will eventually stop the music and the student that is still moving will not going to play anymore.

Procedure:


- Let the student color the page first.
