Color your heart with your favorite color below then trace the letters under it.



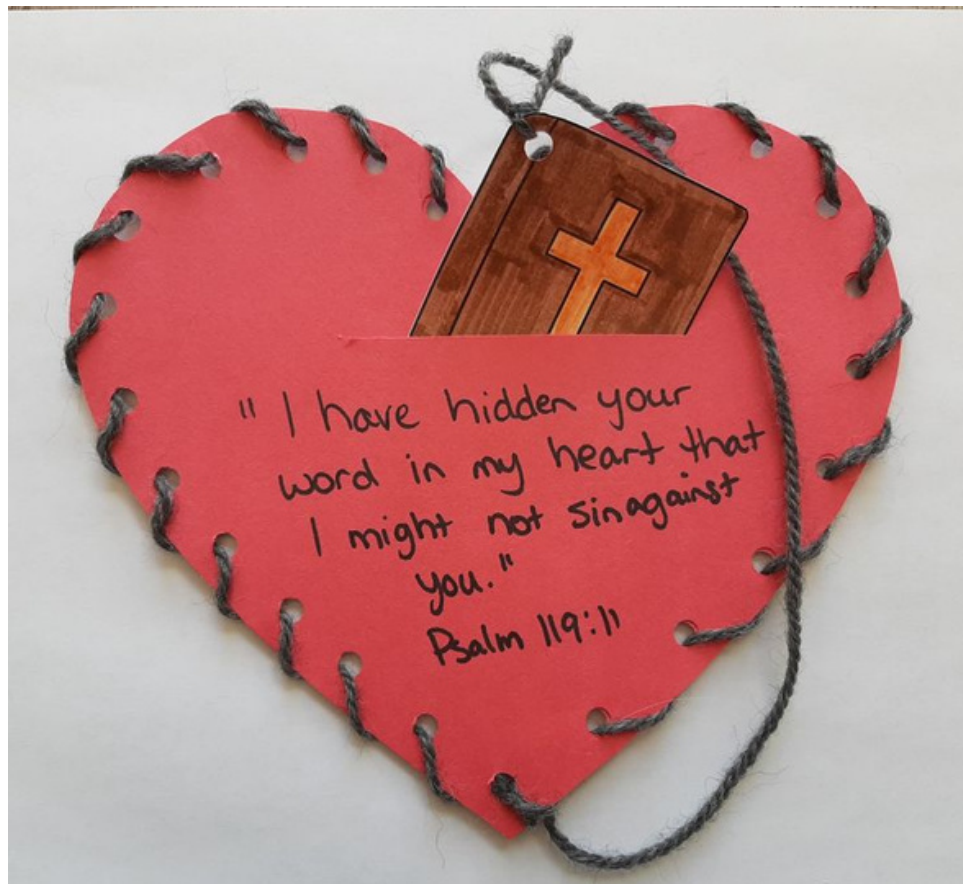
Materials:

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



Materials:

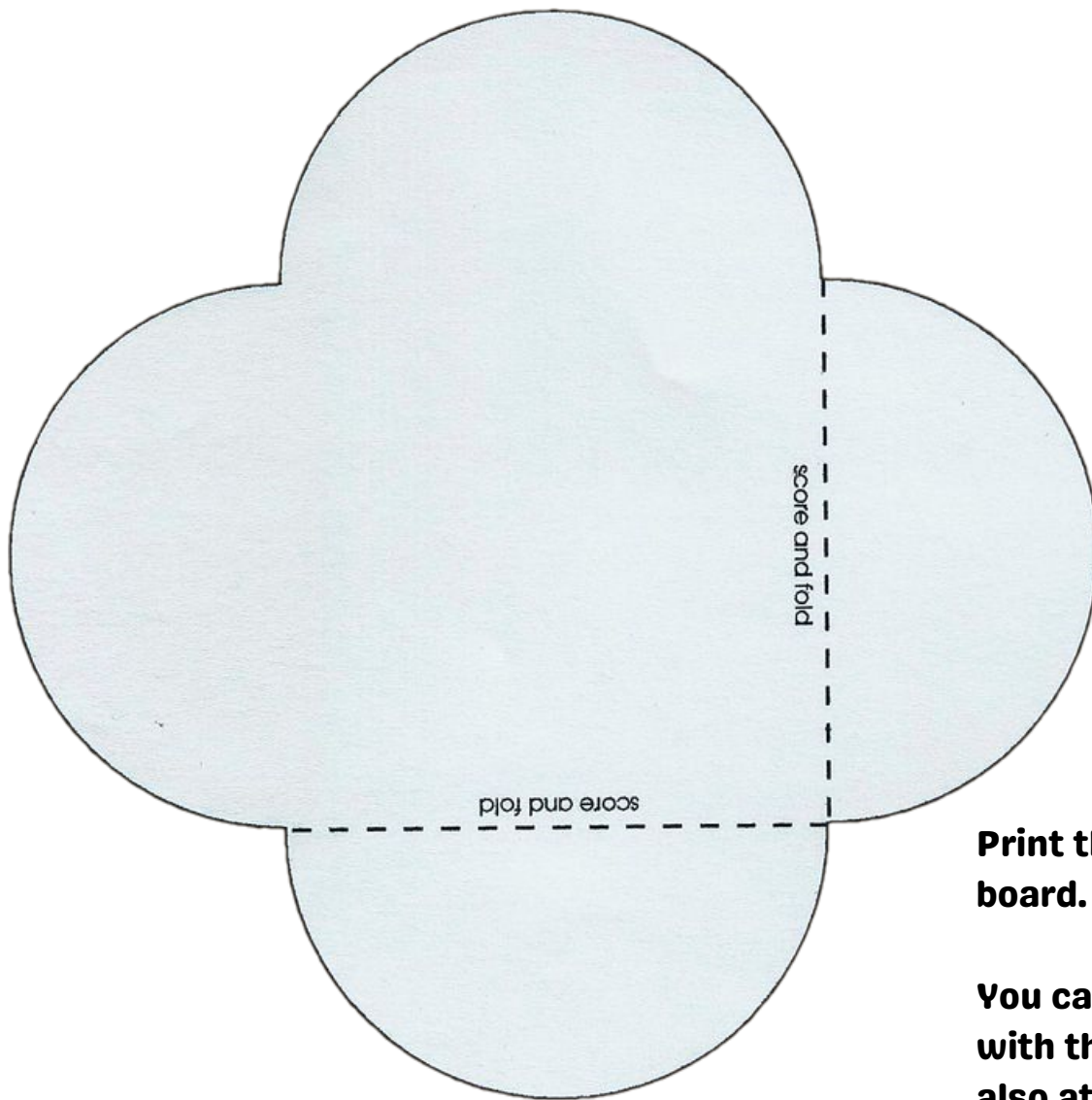
- Red-colored paper

- Paste your memory verse on your heart.

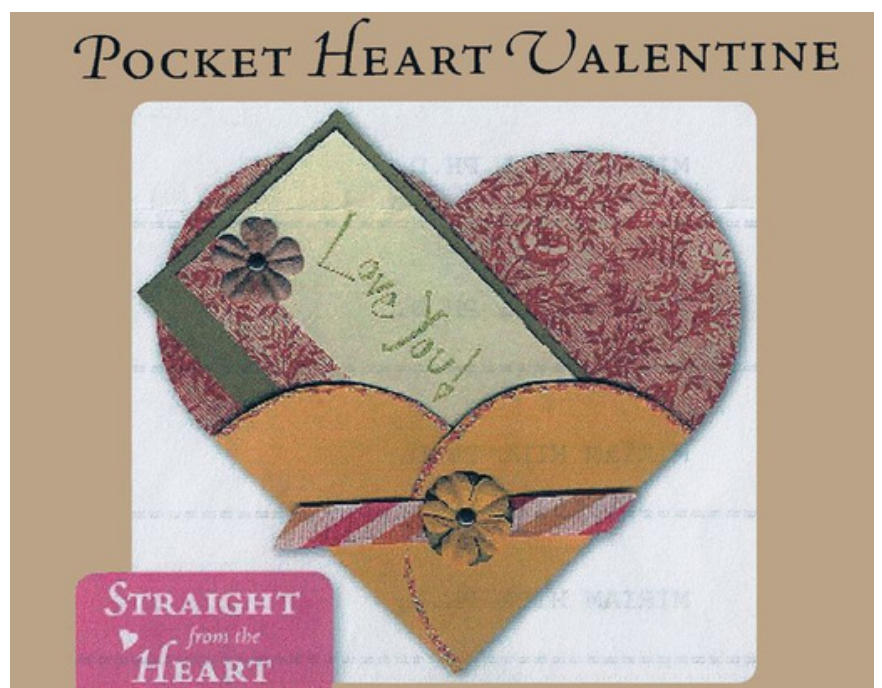

- 1 pc bond paper

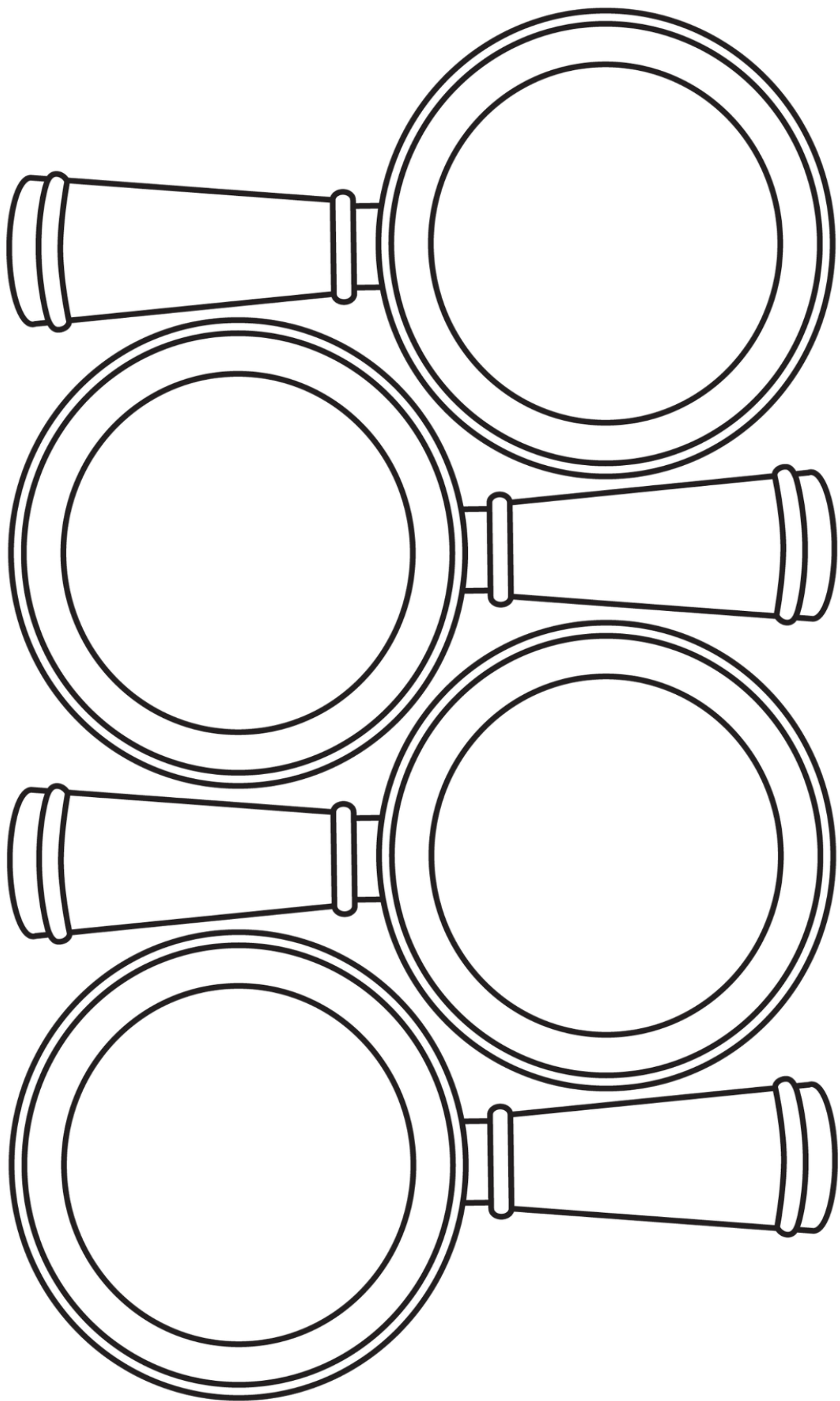

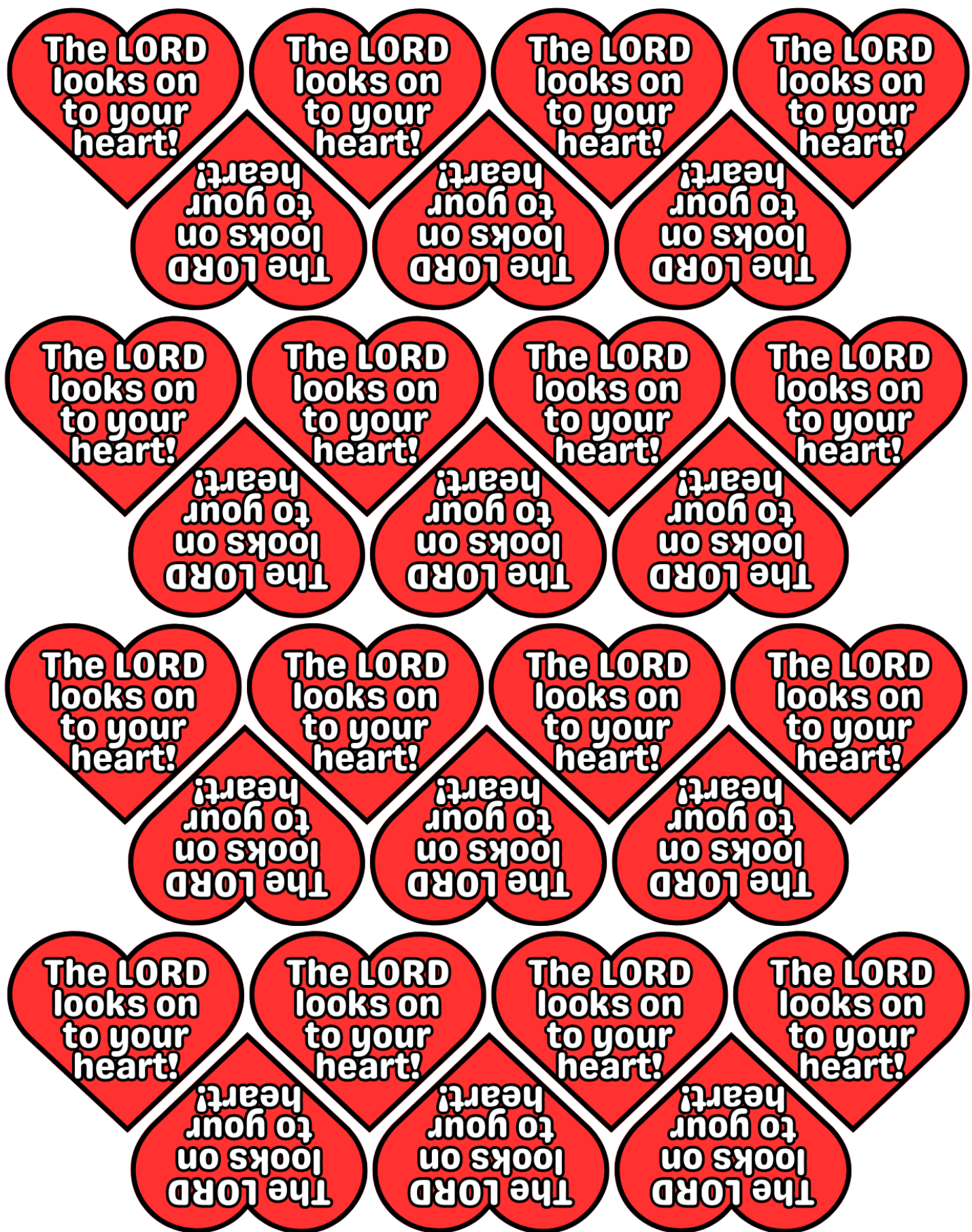
- fold the hearts into half.

Materials:

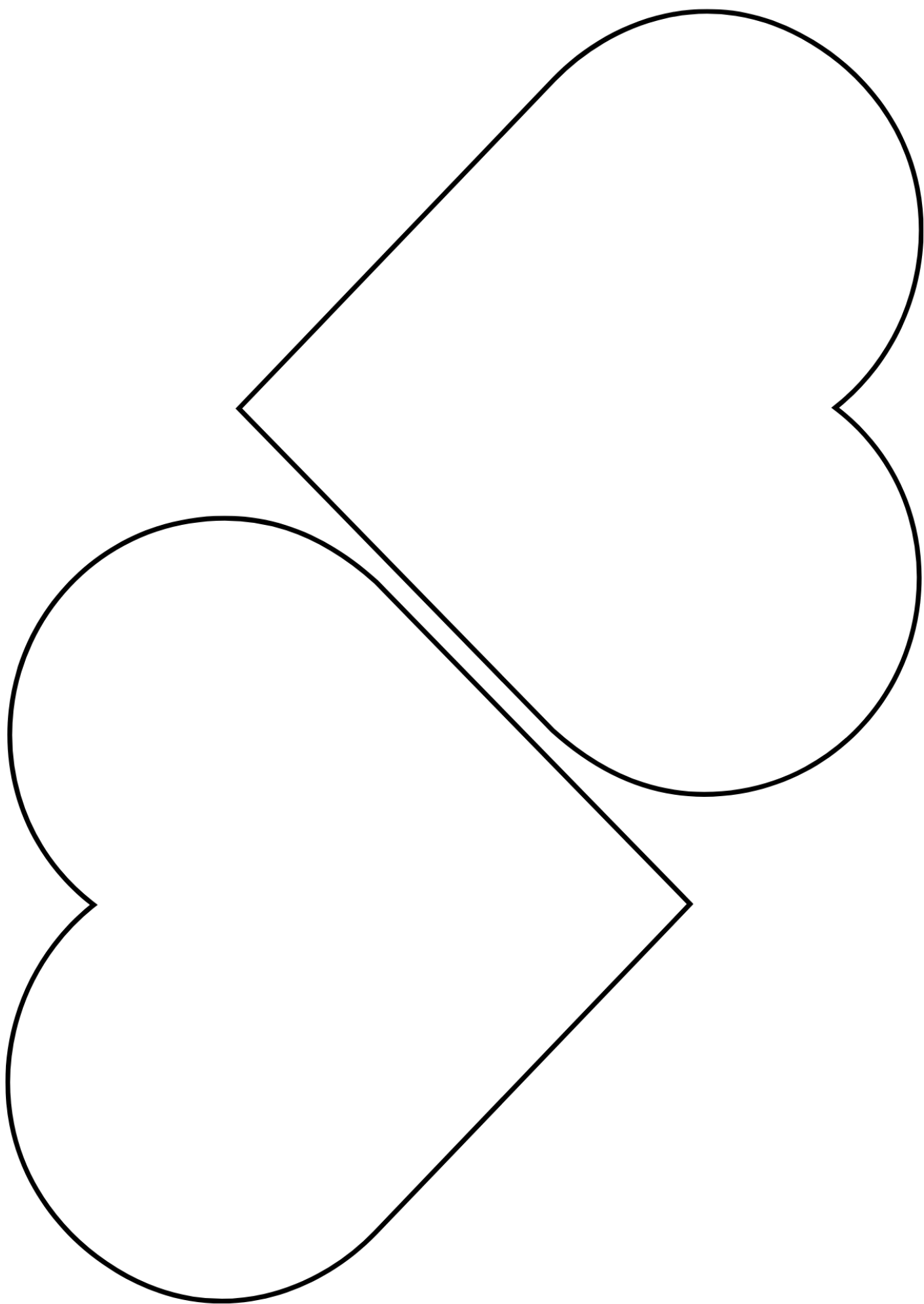
- White crayon
