

LESSON FOR TODDLERS TO PRESCHOOLERS

Approach: Teaching Bible Truth Blended with Basic Learning
(Alphabet and Phonics; Numbers; Shapes and Colors)

Lesson: Recognition of the Letter **Qq**; How it Sounds and How to Write It.

Sub-topics: Different shapes and colors to match.

Main Emphasis: God provides for His children; The Lord took care of His people in the wilderness, and He will take care of us today.

Bible Connect: **God provides Manna & Quail to eat!**

Bible Scripture: Exodus 16:2-15

Memory Verse: Philippians 4:19

"God will supply every need"

Lesson Objectives

By the end of this session, the students must be able to:

1. Recognize the Letter **Qq**, shapes and colors;
2. Explain that God wants us to have hearts that thank Him for the good things He has done for us. When we grumble and complain it shows that we are ungrateful for His gifts. Encourage the kids to think about the things that God has given them.
3. Recite the memory verse with actions;
4. Say a praise or prayer of thanks for God's love;
5. Participate in craft-making and work on the activities given.

Clearing of Difficulties

1. **Manna** - the light bread provided by God to His people for their journey; same bread that they complained about; (ibig sabihin ay "Ano ito?"; tinapay na pinaulan ng Diyos sa mga Israelita.) bread supplied as food to the Israelites in the wilderness
2. **Quail** (pugo) a small short-tailed bird
3. **Complaining** (pagrereklamo) an expression of dissatisfaction or annoyance about something
4. **Wilderness** (ilang) uninhabited region
5. **Provision** (paglaan sa ating kailangan) action of providing or supplying something for use

Pre-Session Activity

BIBLE STORY (youtube [link here](#))

God's people were journeying to a land they would call their own. Now they were free and on their way to a new home. A man named Moses was their leader.

To get to their new home, the people had to walk many miles across a desert. Soon, all the food was gone, and the people began to doubt that God could take care of them. They complained to Moses. But God never forgot His people. God told Moses that food was about to rain down from heaven. As Moses and the people looked out into the desert, they saw a big cloud.

And God did just as He said. Every evening, a great flock of quail (birds) would fly into the camp. The people would gather them and eat them. In the morning, when the people woke up, little white flakes (like wafers) covered the ground. The people called this manna.

Each day, they gathered the manna and took it home to make bread. But God told the people only to gather enough manna to feed their families. God wanted them to do exactly as He said and remember that He would care for them.

For many years, God provided manna and quail for the people. If they obeyed God, they did not have to be hungry.

Life Application

Sometimes you and I grumble and complain, don't we? When do you complain? (Pause for responses.) We forget that God loves us and that He provides us with everything that we need. Instead of grumbling and complaining, we can say, "Thank You, God" and let's do that right now!
