## **Clearing of Difficulties**

### **Pre-Session Activity**

### **Bible Story**

Uriah, a soldier in an army, when there was a time of war he did not go home because other soldiers were out on the field of combat and he did not consider it proper to go to his home. His refusal to go home underscores his commitment to his fellow soldiers, who were still in battle.

### Life Application

It's important to have sympathy for others. The Bible says to love our neighbors as we love ourselves. We should not think only about ourselves comfort while others suffer. When we are at dinner and our plates are full of food. Did you check your mother, father and your siblings if they had enough food too?
